- 4. I prefer big stores to small ones because first, almost everything I need is inside a big store. Second, I find it boring to shop in a small store. Third, big stores often get visited by shoppers. I like seeing a busy crowd therefore big stores are really my preference.
- 5. My favorite store is Urban Outfitters because it offers nice inexpensive clothes ranging from casual to formal. It's easy to pick fashion items at the store since they offer a wide variety of selections, even sizes.
